Empowering Women

WOMEN EVERYWHERE ARE INSPIRED BY SANDY FORSTER AND DYMPHNA BOHOLT AND A DESIRE TO EMULATE THEIR OUTSTANDING FINANCIAL SUCCESSES.

When Sandy Forster married her Maroochydore High School sweetheart she thought she was in seventh heaven. In 1990 however her world came crashing down. "My entire life revolved around money, or more precisely, the lack of it. Although on the outside my life seemed great, on the inside I was a mess. I was angry, frustrated, scared and really had no idea how to change my circumstances," recalled the single mum of two who went on to build a house, expand an already struggling business and incur debts of over \$100,000.

In 1998, Sandy became a passionate advocate of personal development and success strategies, believing that knowledge was power. In 1999 she began a direct sales business, marketing a personal development home-study course. It didn't take long before she was making approximately \$10,000 a month with her best month being \$48,000. The money was great, she still had zero money management skills however she managed to turn herself into a money magnet.

It's a parallel success story for Dymphna Boholt who worked with the prestigious accountancy firm Coopers & Lybrand, and found herself starting over on the Sunshine Coast after a divorce left her with little money, a toddler to support and one on the way. In one year she had accumulated a \$3.5 million property portfolio.

Fast forward to 2004 when Sandy and Dymphna had reinvented themselves and morphed into prosperity mentors, entrepreneurs, authors and more, plus co-founders and co-directors of the Wildly Wealthy Women program: www.wildlywealthywomen.com

The women's mentoring program unleashes the secrets of how women can become successful investors and create multiple streams of income. It teaches them how to keep the money earned, how to attract wealth plus how to ensure assets and savings are fully secured and protected.

The former general manager of Tourism Sunshine Coast Merran Dobson joined the program in 2005 after she found her savings were being eroded, her upbeat single lifestyle needed to be financially secure for the years ahead plus she wasn't taking full advantage of her investments. "Within six months I'd formed a business partnership," Merran explained, "and our portfolio so far consists of four properties in Australia, one of which we have just subdivided in readiness to build a house on and in so doing create a second stream of income, all with little outlay. Plus we own a property in New York State and are looking at commercial or multiple income properties such as units. The portfolio is worth about \$2.2 million. And remember it's not just about property investment. The program empowers women to create a life of total financial and personal freedom, so it can be achieved through many avenues even writing a book or creating a

website to sell your business or products."

The program has members throughout Australia and New Zealand, also Thailand, Vietnam, Japan, USA, there has been interest from Europe and the United Kingdom and the co-founders have recently signed an agreement with an American major marketing guru for a US launch and Wicked Weekend planned for February 2008.

"Another great thing is the people you meet, such as a group of ladies from Western Queensland who were at the last Wicked Weekend at the Hyatt Coolum," enthused Merran. "They called themselves the Mulga Chicks, their families are experiencing hardship because of the drought and they were looking at bringing in another form of income.

"Another inspiring story was the lady who joined the program this year and as a child had suffered atrocities with apartheid in South Africa.

"My goals relate closely to the concept of the program: To create a life of total financial and personal freedom so I can travel the world and play golf at every place I stop. Needless to say I'd also like to live on my passive income derived from my investments and continue to grow my business portfolio."
